

Compassionate Care Fund

Life can be unpredictable, and sometimes urgent needs arise that can be overwhelming. Our Compassionate Care Fund is here to provide timely support to individuals and families served by Diakon programs facing unexpected challenges. Our fund is designed to offer immediate assistance where it's needed most.

Examples of those needs could be:

- An extended family member unexpectedly becomes the caregiver for a child placed in their care due to the parent's inability to provide a safe environment. Their home may not be equipped to accommodate the child, needing items like a bed, clothes, or child-proofing supplies.
- An individual experiences a severe mental health crisis but lacks insurance or the means to pay for immediate therapy or counseling. Without prompt intervention, their situation could deteriorate rapidly.
- Unplanned emergencies, like home repairs or unexpected health crises, can add financial strain on foster families already managing tight budgets.

Student Fulfills Dream with Scholarship Support




Meet Alana, a bright and determined young woman who has been the recipient of Diakon's Youth Scholarship Fund. Diakon offers these academic scholarships to current and former participants of any Diakon Child, Family & Community Ministries programs, including youth services, adoption and foster care, and family life counseling services. Alana, who was part of our adoption and foster care program, is using these funds to help pay for her tuition and room and board at Howard University in the graduate program where she is studying sociology. These funds also enabled her to afford to attend Howard for her undergraduate studies, where she graduated with a Bachelor of Science in political science, magna cum laude, in May 2024.

Alana's career goals have changed over the last four years. She was pretty certain she wanted to be an attorney and work with children in the foster care system or be an immigration attorney. However, she's had an opportunity to apply for a fellowship in the government and hopes to be accepted into that program. Alana shares, "I know that my degree from Howard, my compassion for

people, and my ability to problem solve will guide me in the correct direction for my career."

Diakon has impacted Alana's life in many ways besides receiving the scholarship funds.



Alana was adopted as a newborn, and she's incredibly proud of how far she's come. "If the right family hadn't been so carefully chosen for me, I might not be where I am today," she says. "Without the support of our adoption worker, things could have been harder. Adoption has been an emotional roller coaster, even now, but I'm proud of what I've achieved, including working for CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) in

Harrisburg the past two summers. Giving back to kids in the system has been an important part of my journey."

In addition to her academic pursuits, Alana has been successfully competing on Howard University's Swim and Dive team. She has held two records over the last four years that she's been on the team. She plans to apply for a fellowship in the government within the next year during her second year of graduate school. "I am forever grateful for the financial assistance that Diakon has provided me while attending Howard University, especially during graduate school, as scholarships for graduate studies are very difficult to obtain," Alana shares.
